STAT 823: Large Sample Theory

Objectives: The purpose of this course is to introduce you to important concepts in asymptotic (large-sample) theory. Our approach will be more "causal," but understanding and writing detailed arguments will be vital. A mastery of the material from STAT 712–713 is assumed.

Course Overview: We will cover the basics of the large sample theory and asymptotics of likelihood-based inferential statistics and M-estimators.

Homework: Homework will be assigned on a regular basis. Each student must write up his/her solutions independently of others.

Exam Schedule: There will be either a final examination on Thursday, May 5, at 12:30 pm or a final take-home project (due time and rules will be informed in class).

Grade Breakdown: Your course grade will be determined by your performance on homework (60 percent) and the final examination/project (40 percent). Final course grades will be assigned according to a 90(A)-85(B+)-80(B)-75(C+)-70(C)-65(D+)-60(D)-(F) protocol.
